

## NOTICE OF RCI REOPENING GUIDANCE

To reduce confusion and/or avoid wasted travel, registrants are advised of the following restrictions and program requirements. While we are taking steps to address the pandemic issues, if you are a person who is vulnerable or physically compromised as relates to the impact of COVID-19, you should consider the CDC Guidance and all statements made by the Department of Human Services. You also have the option of taking the required coursework remotely. Visit the Arkansas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board Website to identify those courses pre-approved by the board before enrolling.

### PER CDC GUIDANCE, YOU MUST NOT ENTER THE COURSE FACILITY IF:

1. You have had a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher in the past 2 days
2. You have a cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, new loss of taste or other symptoms that are typical of COVID – 19
3. You have had known exposure to someone with COVID-19 in the past 14 days.

### DURING YOUR ATTENDANCE OF THE PROGRAM:

- Wear a face mask when entering or leaving the building, or leaving your station during the courses.
- Temperature will initially be taken, and recorded by a remote thermometer. If you have a fever at or above the 100.4 degree level you will be asked to leave the facility.
- Signing of a certification acknowledgement that none of the above 3 conditions apply is required.
- Coughing or sneezing should be into the arm inside of the elbow
- Distancing should be maintained by occupying the seats that have been separated for the program in order to sustain the spacing.
- Avoid congregating during breaks by maintaining proper spacing when communicating with others. No more than two persons in the restroom at a time.
- When seated, remain facing forward toward the instructor. You may wear you face mask.
- Snacks and refreshments will be individually pre-packaged.
- Hand sanitizer and antivirus cleaners will be provided and used as required
- Do not share materials brought or provided
- Don't forget to retrieve the course completion documentation before leaving the facility at the end of the course.
- Do what you are supposed to do. If it frustrates you, "get over it".
